
Public procurement – main features

Purchase of works, supplies and services by public bodies

- Initiative and control lie entirely with the contracting authority who produces the detailed specifications
- The results of the action remain the property of the contracting authority
- The contractor's invoice is only paid in exchange of the delivered services, as per the contract signed by both parties

(grants and procurements)


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




Annual work programme 2022 - Overview









Procurements – which procedures in HaDEA?

Open procedure

Any economic operator who is interested may submit a tender.

Framework contract

Establishes the general outline of the services or supplies to be delivered. Requires an additional step to make the actual purchase, i.e. a request for service. The invitation to submit a tender is only sent to the economic operators that are part of the framework contract.

Competitive procedure with negotiations

Two steps procedure. In the first step only the exclusion and selection criteria are assessed and in the second step the award criteria are evaluated. Any interested economic operator may ask to take part in the first step of this procedure, but only those invited can submit a tender that will be evaluated in the second step.

What is TED eTendering?

TED eTendering is an EU institutions' eProcurement platform based on EU Directives on public procurement. Allowing free electronic access to call for tenders' documents such as contractual documentation, technical specifications, annexes, questions and answers etc., TED eTendering effectively represents an added-value extension to TED (Tenders Electronic Daily), the online version of the "Supplement to the Official Journal of the European Union".

How can I benefit from TED eTendering?

TED eTendering provides free electronic access to calls for tenders published by **EU institutions**, **agencies and other bodies**. It is integrated and synchronized with TED eNotices and TED website, where public procurement notices are published.

TED eTendering users can benefit from the following services:

Contracting Authorities


- A collaborative eProcurement environment for preparing and publishing call for tenders' documentation
- Easy management of the preparation and publication of questions and answers
- Synchronization with the contract notice filled in on TED eNotices and published on TED website
- Automatic publication of the call for tenders on the same day as the contract notice
- Generation of reports, statistics on documents downloaded, subscribers etc.
- Possibility to publish calls for tenders for all types of procedures, even lower value procedures independently form TED website

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

Tender specifications

Tenderers should **read carefully** the tender specifications, which include:

- Description of the service / supply to be purchased by the contracting authority
- Procedure used for the procurement (open / restricted / competitive with negotiation)
- Minimum requirements, selection and exclusion criteria
- Award criteria
- List of documents that the tenderer will need to submit with its offer



General information on tendering

- Economic operators can submit a tender either as a sole tenderer or as a group of tenderers.
 A joint tender is a situation where a tender is submitted by a group (with or without legal form) of economic operators regardless of the link they have between them. The group as a whole is considered a tenderer.
 - All members of the group assume joint and several liability towards the Contracting authority for the performance of the contract as a whole.
 - Group members must appoint a Group leader and a single point of contact authorised to act on their behalf in connection with the submission of the tender and all relevant questions, clarification requests, notifications, etc., that may be received during the evaluation, award and until the contract signature.
 - The joint tender must clearly indicate the role and tasks of each member and of the Group leader who will act as the Contracting authority's contact point for the contract's administrative or financial aspects and operational management. The Group leader will have full authority to bind the group and each of its members during contract execution. If the joint tender is successful, the Contracting authority shall sign the contract with the Group leader, authorised by the other members to sign the contract on their behalf via power of attorney.




Sub-contracting

- Subcontracting is the situation where the contractor enters into legal commitments with other
 economic operators which will perform part of the contract on its behalf. The contractor
 retains full liability towards the Contracting authority.
- All contractual tasks may be subcontracted unless the Technical specifications expressly reserve
 the execution of certain critical tasks to the sole tenderer itself, or in case of a joint tender, to a
 member of the group.
- Tenderers are required to give an indication of the proportion of the contract that they intend
 to subcontract, as well as to identify and describe briefly the envisaged contractual
 roles/tasks of subcontractors meeting any of these conditions for performance of the contract as
 a whole.
- Any such subcontractor must provide the tenderer with a commitment letter.
- Changes concerning subcontractors identified in the tender (withdrawal/replacement of a subcontractor, additional subcontracting) during the procurement procedure (after the submission deadline and before contract signature) require the prior written approval of the Contracting authority subject to verifications.

Description: The main objective of this tender is to support EU Member States in overcoming obstacles to vaccination: 1. carry out a mapping of vaccination services in all EU Member States to identify obstacles to vaccination of physical, practical and administrative nature; 2. assess, on the basis of a large-scale survey among EU citizens in all EU Member States and a survey among health professionals in EU Member States, to what extent these obstacles have a negative impact on vaccination coverage rates; 3. identify, on the basis of criteria developed by the Commission, best practices developed by EU Member States to overcome such obstacles; 4. organise onsite-visits to the EU Member States from which best practices have been identified, for the other EU Member States to learn about those 5. pilot best practices in volunteering EU Member States; and 6. develop final recommendations for overcoming obstacles to vaccination of physical, practical and administrative nature.


To use e-Submission, participants (all members of a consortium) must be registered in the Commission online register of organisations participating in the EU grants or procurement procedures. After registration, each organisation obtains a Participant Identification Code (PIC). Registration is free of charge and takes about 5-10 minutes to complete. 

Evaluation of tenders

- The evaluation of the tenders that comply with the submission conditions consists of the following elements:
 - Check if the tenderer has access to procurement (see Section 2.2)
 - Verification of administrative compliance (e.g. signed by duly authorised representative(s) of the tenderer)
 - Verification of non-exclusion of tenderers on the basis of the exclusion criteria.
 - Selection of tenderers on the basis of selection criteria.
 - Verification of compliance with the minimum requirements defined in the tender specifications
 - Evaluation of tenders on the basis of the award criteria
- The Contracting authority will evaluate the abovementioned elements in the order that it considers to be the most appropriate. If the evaluation of one or more elements demonstrates that there are grounds for rejection, the tender will be rejected and will not be subjected to further full evaluation.



Exclusion & selection criteria

• The objective of the exclusion criteria is to assess whether the tenderer is in any of the exclusion situations listed in Article 136(1) of the Financial Regulation. As evidence of non-exclusion each tenderer needs to submit with its tender a Declaration on Honour (Annex 2)

- The objective of the selection criteria is to assess whether the tenderer has:
 - Legal and regulatory capacity
 - Economic and financial capacity
 - Technical and professional capacity



Informing the tenderers

- ALL tenderers are informed about the results of the procedure, whether they
 are successful or unsuccesful
- The letter will include the outcomes of the assessment of the offer they have submitted



Contract signature

- The successful tenderer will receive the contract for their signature
- HaDEA uses QES (qualified electronic signature)
- If the contractor does not have QES, they will have to sign in blue ink and send the signed contract to HaDEA for a countersignature
- The contract enters into force when both parties will have signed it

Cancer- CR

PIN published! Development of a code of conduct on fair access of cancer survivors to financial services.

Activities will include stakeholders engagement to identify obstacles and challenges for cancer survivors to access financial services and work with business; drafting a code of conduct to ensure developments in cancer treatments and their improved effectiveness are reflected in the business practices of financial service providers; ensuring that only necessary and proportionate information is used for the assessment of applicants eligibility for financial products. It will also include recommendations for potential regulatory action at Union level.

Indicative budget: €2 000 000

PIN published! Guidelines on access to healthcare for people with disabilities.

The overall objectives are to: a) map and analyse bottlenecks in accessing healthcare for people with disabilities; b) provide guidelines on how to increase access and overcome barriers in access to healthcare for people with disabilities; c) shed light on the situation of the people with disabilities in terms of access to cancer diagnosis and care

Indicative budget: €700 000

Crisis prepardeness - CP

PIN published! Study on market research and mapping of innovative diagnostic testing solutions (HERA).

To support the gathering of information and mapping of innovative diagnostic solutions that could be used for preparedness and response to cross-border health threats. The expected results are the identification of the current developments and the future production of in-vitro diagnostics for the early and reliable identification of relevant cross-border health threats, as well as an analysis of the supply chains and any possible bottlenecks.

Indicative budget: €1 000 000

IT development for early warning, modelling, simulation, forecast (HERA)
