# EU4Health – 4 General objectives

EU4Health is a clear message that public health is a priority for Europe and it is the instrument to pave the way to a European Health Union



**IMPROVE & FOSTER HEALTH** through disease prevention and health promotion, as well as international health initiatives and cooperation



PROTECT PEOPLE FROM SERIOUS CROSS-BORDER HEALTH THREATS through prevention, preparedness and response to cross-border health threats, complementing national stockpiling of essential crisis-relevant products and establishing a reserve of medical, healthcare and support staff;



**IMPROVE ACCESS TO MEDICINAL PRODUCTS, MEDICAL DEVICES & CRISIS-RELEVANT PRODUCTS** by encouraging sustainable production and supply chains and innovation in the Union as well as efficient use of medicinal products;



STRENGTHEN THE NATIONAL HEALTH SYSTEMS through improved health data use and re-use, development of digital tools and services, digital transformation of healthcare, enhancing access to healthcare, developing and implementing Union health legislation and evidence-based decision-making and integrated work among MS health systems.

- Enhancement of availability, accessibility & affordability of medicinal products, medical devices and crisis-relevant products
- Strengthening health data, digital tools & services, digital transformation of healthcare;
- Enhancing access to healthcare;
- Developing and implementing EU health legislation and evidence-based decision making;
- Integrated work among MS health systems.



#### **POLICY CONTEXT** / health challenges:

- COVID-19 pandemic; NCDs; health determinants; ageing society; vulnerable groups; rare diseases; poor nutrition; physical inactivity; obesity; tobacco use and harmful use of alcohol; cardiovascular diseases; dementia; age-related diseases and disabilities;
- access to sustainable, efficient, equitable, and affordable high-quality medicinal products;
- patients views & access to diagnosis/rare disease;
- people in vulnerable situations & mental illness, NCD&CD.

#### **OBJECTIVES, SCOPE AND ACTIVITIES**

- To ensure the participation of health NGOs in activities that are necessary to implement one or more specific objectives of the EU4Health Programme.
- To provide support to the functioning of certain NGOs during 2022 for <u>activities including</u>:
  - awareness raising on various health aspects
  - communication and dissemination
  - capacity building and training
  - expert collaboration and networking.



#### **EXPECTED RESULTS AND IMPACT**

- deliver on increased health literacy and health promotion, capacity building and networking contributing to the optimisation of healthcare activities and practices, by providing feedback from and facilitating communication with patients.
- demonstrate in their proposals the Union added value of their activities
- Commit to deliver concrete results such as: online materials, webpages, manuals and tools on case studies promoting health in schools, factsheets and relevant literature, materials for teachers on health literacy, and assistance and promotion of twinning with other European schools; capacity-building and training activities to reduce the impact of risk factors for non-communicable diseases; new approaches to promote healthy and sustainable diets; expert guidance and peer-to-peer connections; and collaborate in shared areas of activity
- contribute to the implementation of non-legislative policy initiatives and/or the implementation of relevant Union health legislation (some activities)
- facilitate the exchange of knowledge, capacity building related to their expertise and should cooperate with other civil society organisations and international organisations (e.g. WHO and other organisations).

#### **Eligibility**

 Only last two years - the proofs necessary to assess eligibility (not-for-profit; independence of industry, commercial and business; public health area;

#### **Exceptional utility**

At least 30 % of the budget of the operating grants is allocated to <u>activities in (one or more)</u>
<u>Member States</u> whose Gross Net Income per inhabitant is less than 90% of the EU average
