Data space for cultural heritage (deployment)

- What is the common European data space for cultural heritage
- A data space to support the digital transformation of Europe's cultural sector. It will foster the creation and reuse of content in various sectors, with value for the economy and society.
- The data space will build on the Europeana Digital Service Infrastructure (DSI) and will expand its
 current functionalities, in particular in relation to 3D, re-use of digitised cultural resources as well as
 cross-sector and cross-border cooperation. The data space will also build on the current <u>Europeana</u>
 Strategy 2020-2025.
- The Commission Recommendation C(2021)7953 of 10 November 2021 paves the way for the common European data space for cultural heritage.
- A call for tenders will soon be launched for the set up of the data space (**first work strand** of the topic 2.2.1.6 Data space for cultural heritage (deployment) of the DIGITAL WP 2021-2022).



- This call covers the **second work-strand** of the topic 2.2.1.6 Data space for cultural heritage (deployment) of the DIGITAL WP 2021-2022.
- The grants will contribute to the deployment of the data space for cultural heritage.
- The call focuses on seizing the opportunities of advanced technologies for increasing the quality, sustainability, use and re-use of the data space. Projects will build digital capacity in the cultural sector by collaborating with existing and relevant European, national and regional initiatives and platforms.

Call profile

- Budget: **€4 million**
- Funding rate: **75% for SMEs** (SME support grant) and **50%** for all other beneficiaries
- Indicative duration: 24 months
- At minimum 3 entities from 3 different eligible countries. SME participation is highly encouraged.



- We are looking for actions to:
- Enrich the offer of data, tools and services available on the data space (such as access to high quality and high-value datasets, tools, technical know-how references, and other services)
- Use existing Artificial Intelligence and machine-learning systems to improve user-engagement and experience (for example, via automatic translations, automatic enrichments, adaptive filtering, personalised recommendations or in other aspects of the data space).
- Re-use available digitised cultural heritage assets, in particular 3D, in important domains such as education, social sciences and humanities, tourism and the wider cultural and creative sector.

Projects must cover at least one of these application areas.



Outcomes and deliverables

The actions' outcomes will contribute to the *global* outcomes and deliverables of the deployment of the data space for cultural heritage:

- Facilitate the digital transformation of the cultural sector and capacity building, enabling a pan-European innovative data platform infrastructure with easy online access to European cultural content.
- High-value datasets available for re-use, in particular 3D datasets, including for conducting scientific research, preservation and restoration purposes, re-use by the cultural and creative sector
- Allow stakeholders of the wider cultural sector to further enlarge, use and benefit from this data space.
- Numerous digital opportunities for the public, ranging from virtual visits to museums, libraries, galleries and heritage sites to history reconstruction and education;



What do we NOT want?

- It is not about the set up of the data space (first work strand, via procurement), nor of other infrastructures
- It is not about research (eg using existing AI/ML technologies is called for)
- Activities that are not contributing to the development and deployment of the data space -eg
 - ≠ Resulting data, tools or services that cannot be integrated in the data space
 - ≠ Reuse of data outside the data space, or reuse cases with no exploitation
- Lack of sustainability of outcomes



Targeted stakeholders

Types of main stakeholders addressed

- Cultural heritage organisations, cultural heritage stakeholders, academic and research organisations, technology providers, stakeholders in education, humanities, tourism, creative sectors interested in re-using data.
- At minimum entities from 3 eligible countries. SME participation is highly encouraged.
- Existing actors/partnerships (participation not limited to those)
 - Consortia of the CEF Europeana DSI (CSP and Generic Services projects)
 - National, domain and thematic accredited aggregators (Europeana Aggregator Forum)



Award criteria

Relevance

- Alignment with the objectives and the application areas of the call (section 2)
- Contribution to long-term policy objectives, policies and strategies, and synergies with activities at European and national level
 - Support with the implementation of the objectives of the Commission Recommendation of 10/11/2021, alignment with the provisions of the Digital Europe Programme, the European Data Strategy,...
- Extent to which the project would reinforce and secure the digital technology supply chain in the EU*
 - Applicants need to provide information or explain when their proposed project is not concerned.
- Extent to which the project can overcome financial obstacles such as the lack of market finance*
 - Not applicable to this topic.



Award criteria

Implementation

- Maturity of the project
- Soundness of the implementation plan and efficient use of resources
 - Measurable performance indicators, with a clear baseline and ambitious targets, will be considered positively in the score
 - Deliverables must include a 'Dissemination and exploitation plan' (in the first 6 months), an 'Integration report' (in the first 6 months of the project), a 'Sustainability plan' (6 months before end of project), and a 'Technical progress report' (every 6 months)
- Capacity of the applicants, and when applicable the consortium as a whole, to carry out the proposed work



Award criteria

Impact

- Extent to which the project will achieve the expected outcomes and deliverables referred to in the call for proposals and, where relevant, the plans to disseminate and communicate project achievements
 - Extent to which the proposed action's outcomes will contribute to the global expected outcomes of the deployment of the data space for cultural heritage, referred to in the call.
- Extent to which the project will strengthen competitiveness and bring important benefits for society
- Extent to which the project addresses environmental sustainability and the European Green Deal goals, in terms of direct effects and/or in awareness of environmental effects *
 - Applicants need to provide information or explain when their proposed project is not concerned.
