Call for proposals: objectives

- Increase awareness, knowledge generation, and sharing, and capacity building to improve mental health and psychological wellbeing in migrants and refugee populations.
- special focus on Ukraine's displaced people
- Implementation of promising and best practices and guidance.





Activities

- Exchange and implementation of best practices that will increase awareness, knowledge sharing and support for health professionals and NGOs working with refugees.
- Focus on the needs of Ukraine's displaced people who are mainly located in Ukraine's neighboring countries or in other EU member states
- Support for NGOs and health professionals speaking Ukrainian/Russian who work with displaced people from Ukraine.





Mandatory deliverables

- Other organisations working with Ukraine's displaced people, (e.g. WHO, UNHCR, Red Cross, Caritas, etc.) and include interaction with them.
- Practices should be implemented through on the ground activities and in consultation with representatives from the community or target group concerned (migrants, refugees, displaced people from Ukraine).





Mandatory deliverables

Evaluation of the implementation

 Plan for further roll-out of practice in other EU countries where the displaced people may find placement





Specific action-level indicators

- Number of training materials translated by number of languages
- Number of health professionals and NGOs making use of the training material
- Number of Ukrainian displaced people benefiting from the action (by country)





Budget and duration

- EUR 2 000 000
- Proposals to be awarded under this topic: Up to three proposals
- Recommended length of a project is 24 months





Eligibility

Special requirements

Applicants – specific eligibility criteria	Academia and educational institutions, civil society organisations supporting migrants and refugees (health and social professional associations, schools, foundations, NGOs and similar entities).
Specific eligibility criteria applicable to the consortium composition	The consortium must also include at least one NGO active in the field of mental health, preferably at Union level, and at least one NGO working in the area of migrants and refugees.
Non-eligible activities	No
Financial support to third parties	No
Place of implementation	No
