EC work on vaccination policy

- Council Recommendation on strengthened cooperation against vaccine-preventable diseases - 2018
 - Coalition for Vaccination
 - European Vaccination Information Portal (ECDC)
 - Special Eurobarometer Europeans' attitudes towards vaccination
 - ECDC/EMA vaccine monitoring platform (COVID-19 post-marketing surveillance studies)
 - Joint procurement of pandemic influenza vaccines

Call for proposals – policy context (1)

Recent health crises:

- COVID-19 pandemic historic large-scale vaccination of entire populations
 - Design of vaccination plans
 - Set-up of appropriate infrastructure and easily accessible, sufficiently resourced vaccination services
 - Communication and outreach activities to ensure high uptake of the vaccines, including activities to address vaccine hesitancy and disinformation on related risks
- Monkeypox surge in initiatives in the field of vaccination



Call for proposals – policy context (2)

Transfer of knowledge: there is a need to gain efficiency and develop strategies in large-scale vaccination for other health crisis or national vaccination programmes

- Interested in key <u>public health</u> findings in the field of vaccination (Note: <u>this is not an R&D call</u> !)
- Apply findings from innovative public health research/ studies/ initiatives to enhance the efficiency of vaccination programmes, and consequently vaccine coverage
 - Crisis preparedness future health crisis involving mass vaccination
 - routine vaccination programmes
 - catch-up vaccination, e.g. interruptions / delays during the pandemic



Objective and scope of the call (1)

- The action aims to support Member States and relevant stakeholders to implement key public health findings on vaccination
 - Findings derived from recent health crises (COVID-19, monkeypox) or other vaccinations events
- Countries must continue to improve vaccination coverage, or sustain high levels of vaccination, to avoid potential life-threatening outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases



Objective and scope of the call (2)

The proposal may concern any aspects of the implementation of vaccination programmes, including but not limited to:

- improvements to the strategy and planning of vaccination events
- better logistics or staffing planning and organisation
- the actual administration of the vaccines (e.g. new delivery models such as mobile units)











Activities to be funded under this topic

- a) mapping public health evidence and research results on large-scale vaccination
- b) identifying challenges and assessing the feasibility to implement solutions in Member States, based on the mapping and taking country-specific factors into account
- c) developing implementation plans and pilot activities to respond to the current pandemic context or future health crises, or to optimise current routine vaccination practices, including catch-up vaccination
- d) implementing the pilot activities in volunteering Member States including the activities identified as potentially most effective
 - Examples: training programmes for health professionals, awareness-raising campaigns to tackle vaccine hesitancy, infrastructure initiatives, dedicated events for the exchange of good practices, etc...
- e) identifying successful pilot activities and, based on these, develop a robust sustainability plan for continued implementation and toolkits and recommendations for upscaling in other Member States



Expected results and impact

- □ Deliver an inventory of relevant innovative public health research on COVID-19 large-scale vaccination
- □ Implement plans in relevant Member States taking into account feasibility and country-specific factors
- ☐ This will result, based on pilot projects implemented in several Member States and, after assessment, in the development of sustainability plans and toolkits and recommendations
- ☐ These activities are expected to **enhance large-scale vaccination programmes**, making the best possible use of public health findings to increase the uptake of vaccines (either in the context of health crisis e.g. COVID-19, MKPX or routine and catch-up vaccination programmes)
