#### **BACKGROUND AND POLICY CONTEXT**

- Europe's Beating Cancer Plan: Focuses on childhood cancer, aiming to enhance the multidisciplinary cancer workforce.
- Current Situation: Significant lack of psychosocial care for children with cancer in many European countries. By 2030 an estimated 750,000 pediatric cancer survivors in Europe will need such care.
- Role of Psycho-Oncologists: They work alongside oncologists to provide therapy and guide patients toward positive treatment perceptions. Psycho-oncological care is crucial at all disease stages, improving patients' quality of life by addressing their psychological state and supporting their families.
