 A: HCV can still be included even if subtopic b) indeed has a focus on vaccine-preventable infections.
 - Q: 3. Is it expected to focus on one vulnerable group or to include multiple ones? A: There are no a priori restrictions in relation to this, provided it makes sense to the proposed approach.
- **14.** Q: DP/CR-g-24-29 subtopic b): When referring to vulnerable groups, the call often quotes displaced people from Ukraine and Roma in the EU. Is it advised to involve one or both of these groups or can we focus only on other vulnerable groups (e.g. prisoners)? A: You can focus on other vulnerable groups.

- **72.** Q: Is there a chance to have the list of participants to this event? It would be very useful! A: The list of participants is not distributed however, you can refer to the chat if you wish to see participants that have shared their contact information.
- **73.** Q: Hello, Alexandra and Andreea here, from National Health Insurance House in Romania. We have a question about the presentation for EU4H-2024-DGA-MS-IBA-01 (DI-g-24-75), it will take place today?
 - A: This is an info session only for the open call for proposals (call EU4H-2024-PJ-03).
- **74.** Q: In the case where the conditions of exceptional utility above are met, the funding rate is automatically increased to 80%? Or a specific application for this has to be sent by the consortium and an approval has to be received? In the latter case, what are the conditions for receiving the approval?
 - A: You have the possibility to apply with the 80% funding rate when preparing the proposal.
- **75.** Q: Is the funding rate identical for all partners? Are also public bodies and non for profits having the same funding rate (60% or 80%) than for profit companies?

 A: Please note that the funding rate applies to the project as a whole.
- **76.** Q: Can you clarify please if, once the condition of exceptional importance is met, and the application for 80% funding rate is made during the proposal submission, the award of such funding rate is automatic? Or it can be denied?

 A: The exceptional utility is assessed when the proposal is evaluated, so the higher funding
 - rate will be confirmed at a later stage.
 - **77.** Q: When you say that the funding rate applies to the consortium as a whole, it is unclear which one of the two scenarios below are valid:
 - 1) all partners have the same funding rate irrespective of their legal nature;
 - 2) the consortium can freely decide that some partners have a higher funding rate than others, provided that the average funding rate for the consortium is either 60% or 80%, depending on whether the project is of exceptional utility or not. Can you please clarify? A: The funding rate is the same for all members of the consortium.
- **78.** Q: If the project meets the condition of 30% of the budget being allocated to countries whose GNI per inhabitant is less than 90% of the EU average and we click the 80% funding rate on part A of the application, then is it guaranteed that the funding rate will be 80%? A: The exceptional utility is assessed when the proposal is evaluated, so the higher funding rate will be confirmed at a later stage.

- **79.** Q: The call mentions that "at least 30 % of the budget is allocated to Member States whose GNI per inhabitant is less than 90% of the EU average". Am I correct in thinking that this means a total of 30% for all Member States whose GNI per inhabitant is less than 90% of the EU average and not 30% per member state?

 A: This applies to the budget as a whole, i.e. at least 30% of the budget is allocated to Members States whose GNI per inhabitant is less than 90% of the EU average.
- **80.** Q: The call is: OA-g-24-79 (Action grants to contribute to the organisations of conference and events). The call is now open with a deadline of 22nd Jan 2025. Our organisation is very interested in this call, given that it falls under the remit of our priorities and key objectives. I am writing to inquire about the timeline for the event's eligibility. Assuming we successfully receive and sign the GA (presumably in Q3/Q4 of 2025), could you clarify the projected start date for the project? Would it be permissible to hold the event in 2026, given that it would take place a few months after the official signing of the GA (and within the 12 month period of it being signed)? We are uncertain about the timeline, given that the call states that we are allowed to host the event only in 2024/2025. However, our understanding is that we would only be able to carry out the event, post the signing of the GA. Your clarification on this matter would be greatly appreciated.

A: As per the <u>call document</u>, the conference will be organised in **2024 and/or 2025**. Only the project may run until 2026 (e.g. follow-up after the conference, final payments/reports etc). In addition, according to section 10 of the call document, normally the starting date will be after grant signature. A retroactive starting date can be granted exceptionally for duly justified reasons — but never earlier than the proposal submission date. Therefore, if a retroactive starting date is granted, it is possible to claim costs as from the requested date. Finally, please keep in mind that, as per the topic specifications, conferences which have already been held by the date on which the grant application is submitted are not eligible. in line with the call document, the conference will be organised in **2024 and/or 2025**. The submission date is the date the applicant submits the final version of their proposal, without making further changes (for further details you can also refer to the <u>Online manual</u>) – i.e. a proposal's submission date does not necessarily have to coincide with the deadline (22/01/2025), although this is also possible.

We've reviewed the eligibility details of the proposal and **wondered whether we, being the Spain's public broadcaster, could meet the required eligibility criteria**. Could you please confirm if we could act as a civil society organisation?

- **89.** Q: Regarding the EU4H-2024-PJ-03-6 Call for proposals on advancing the adoption of artificial intelligence in health (DI-g-24-76). I would like to kindly inquire if there are any existing or emerging consortiums that we could contact and follow up with, as we are keen to be involved in the formation of a consortium and the preparation of the application.

 A: This is an open competitive call for proposals HaDEA is not involved in any way in the formation of consortia for the preparation of proposals. Regarding the search for partners, if you wish you can refer to the "Partner search" option on the EU Funding & Tenders Portal.
- **90.** Q: I was wondering if there was a member of your group that could assist or help guide me through the application. I have experience with the youth for action applications /tri and multilateral), but they do not exist any more. We are in the process of finding new partners

in the union that would be interested in learning and sharing the different work methods, ideas and information.

A: To our understanding, you are referring to the call **EU4H-2024-PJ-03**. All information related to this call/topics is available in the <u>call document</u> and on the <u>EU Funding & Tenders Portal</u>. 91. Q: I am writing to seek clarification on an important aspect of the "Call for Proposals to increase health literacy for cancer prevention and care" (ref. EU4H-2024-PJ-02-2). Specifically, I would like to inquire about the funding rate (co-funding) and the implications for for-profit entities participating in this call. As outlined in the call document, it is understood that this grant must not result in a net profit for for-profit organizations. Given this requirement, I would like to ask whether it is permissible for a for-profit entity to allocate any potential "profit" generated from the project to cover the required 40% co-financing. This would ensure compliance with the condition that the grant does not lead to a net financial gain for the organization while still fulfilling the co-financing obligation. Could you please confirm if this approach is acceptable within the framework of this call? Any guidance or additional information you can provide on how for-profit entities should handle this aspect would be greatly appreciated.

A: The eligible costs that are not covered by the grant may be covered by one or more of the categories below:

- pre-existing funding of the beneficiaries (own resources)
- financial contribution by third parties (i.e. grant from a national or a private funding programme)
- income or revenue generated by the action (i.e. by selling results during the duration of the action). 'Revenue' is all income generated by the action, during its duration, for beneficiaries that are profit legal entities. For the purpose of calculating the profit, an ex-post analysis of the revenue generated by the action (by the profit legal entities) and the grant amount over the eligible costs would be necessary at the balance payment.
- In addition, beneficiaries may use in-kind contributions provided by third parties (i.e. seconding personnel, contributing equipment, infrastructure or other assets, or other goods and services made available for free by third parties), if necessary to implement their action. These in-kind contributions are not counted towards the project budget (not eligible costs) as there are no costs that arise for the beneficiaries, and nothing can be charged to the action.  A: All information related to this call is available on the Funding & Tenders Portal and in the call document. As per the call document (p.23), for topic EU4H-2024-PJ-02-2, applications may be either by a single applicant or a consortium (no minimum requirement).

93. Q: Given the approximated budget per project for this call (1 mil. EUR in 3 years), would it be possible to apply for a higher sum if we include many MS and affiliated countries, showing exceptional utility? In another words, would it constitute a reason for immediate disqualification? If not, how much higher can we go if we include, for example, more than 14 countries?

A: As per the <u>call document</u> (p.24), project budgets (maximum grant amount) are listed under section 3 "available budget". **This does not however preclude the submission/selection of proposals requesting other amounts.** It is the applicant's responsibility to decide how to proceed regarding the inclusion of potential beneficiaries in the proposal. HaDEA is not in a position to give advice on the preparation or structure of your proposal for competitive calls – any proposal must be assessed on its own merit.

A1: Yes, as per the call document, one of the conditions needs to be fulfilled.

Q2. In the case of the first condition (i.e. 30% of the budget), does it impose a minimum number of such countries to be involved as partners?

A2: The condition needs to be fulfilled regardless of the number of partners, unless it's an action with bodies from at least 14 Member States (whereby the second condition applies).

Q3. In the case of the same first condition, does it include, when counting the 30% distribution, the eligible non-EU countries from the list provided in the call?

A3: The countries participating in the EU4Health program are included in the calculation (as per the <u>list</u> in the call document).

- **95.** Q: How would you see a potential collaboration work between a country that is (somewhat) eligible under EU4H like Switzerland, but not in Digital Europe?

At this point could you please clarify once again if other EU candidate countries may participate?
