FOCUS ON RESULTS

Any tangible or intangible output of the action, such as data, knowledge & information whatever their form or nature, whether or not they can be protected.

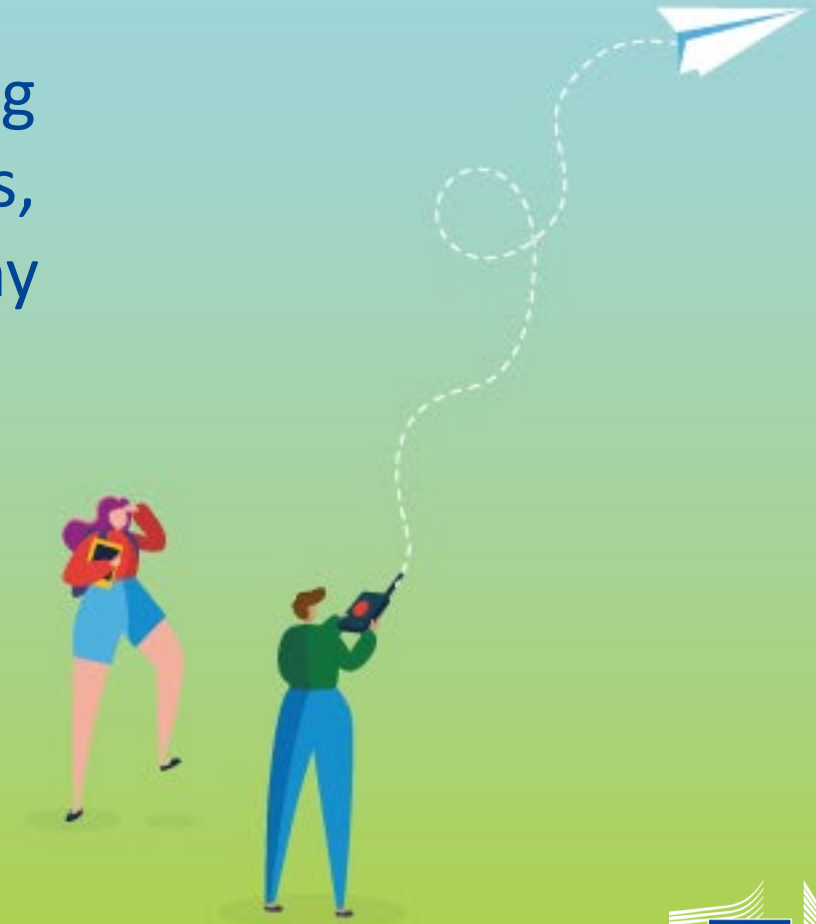
Project results can be reusable and exploitable (e.g. inventions, prototypes, services) as such, or elements (knowledge, technology, processes, networks) that have potential to contribute for further work on research or innovation.

Key exploitable results (KERs) are the **outputs generated during the project which can be used and create impact**, either by the project partners or by other stakeholders



DISSEMINATION

The **public disclosure of the results by appropriate means**, other than resulting from protecting or exploiting the results, including by scientific publications in any medium.



EXPLOITATION



The **use of results** in further research and innovation activities other than those covered by the action concerned, **including** among other things, **commercial exploitation** such as **developing, creating, manufacturing and marketing a product or process, creating and providing a service, or in standardisation activities.**



Communication

Taking **strategic and targeted measures for promoting the action itself** and its results to a multitude of audiences, including the media and the public, and possibly engaging in a two-way exchange.

- **Reach out to society as a whole.**
- Demonstrate how EU funding contributes to tackling societal challenges.
- Strategically planned with pertinent messages, right medium and means.

Dissemination

The **public disclosure of the results by appropriate means**, other than resulting from protecting or exploiting the results, including by scientific publications in any medium.

- **Circulation of knowledge & results to those who can best make use of them.**
- Enabling the value of results to be potentially wider than the original focus.
- Essential element of all good research practice and vital part of the project plan.

Exploitation

The **use of results** in further research and innovation activities, including among other things, commercial exploitation such as developing, creating, manufacturing and marketing a product or process, creating and providing a service, or in standardisation and policy making activities.

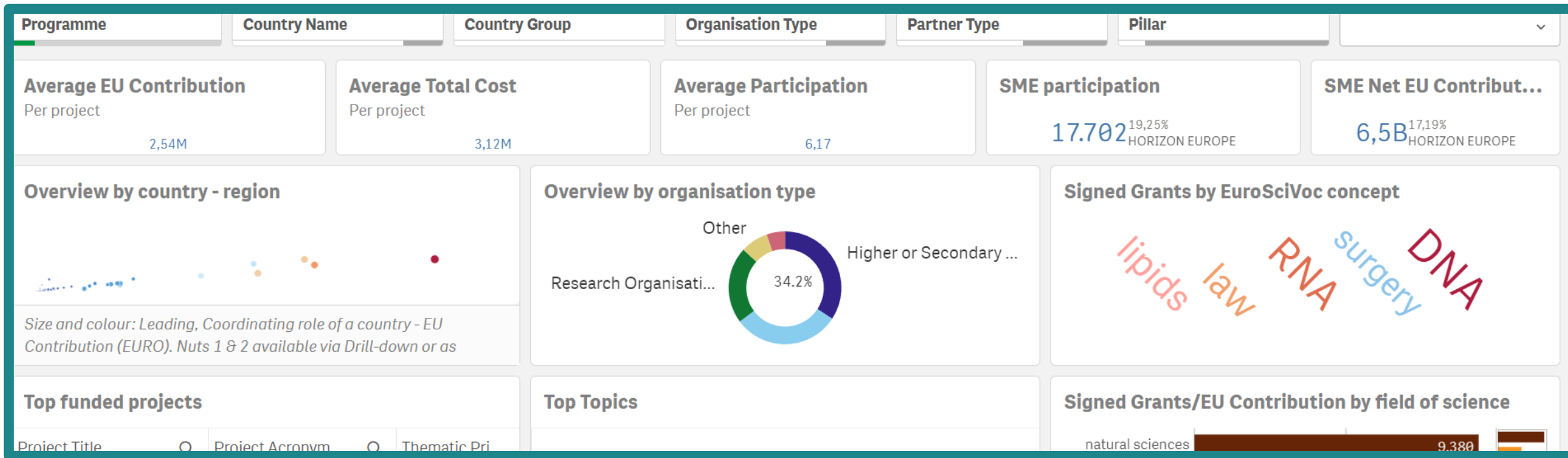
- Recognise exploitable results and their stakeholders, identify the value added from their use.
- Beneficiaries can use their results or let them being exploited (=used) by interested third parties.

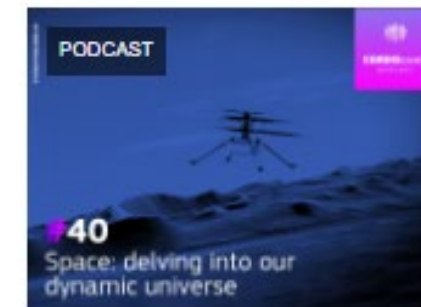

Open access to scientific publications

European Strategy to Open Science

- **Open Access to peer-reviewed scientific publications - mandatory, no exceptions**
 - **Immediate OA via trusted repository** under CC-BY or equivalent; **metadata open** under CC0 or equivalent
 - Information via the trusted repository about data and tools needed to validate conclusions
 - **IPR retention** to comply with OA requirements
- **Research Data Management - mandatory; OA mandatory with exceptions**
 - RDM in line with FAIR, **mandatory Data Management Plan**
 - **OA via trusted repository** under CC-BY or CC0; metadata under CC0;
 - **exceptions to OA possible** ('as open as possible, as closed as necessary')
 - Information about software and other tools needed to reuse or validate data
- **Additional OS practices - encouraged**
 - Providing OA to research outputs beyond publications and data
 - Research output management beyond publications and data
 - Early and open sharing of research, e.g. preregistration, registered reports, preprints
 - Measures to ensure reproducibility of research outputs
 - Involving citizens and end users in co-creating R&I agendas and content

Open Access to scientific publications

- **Freedom to publish in venue of choice** provided that all the open access-related obligation as detailed in the Grant agreement are fulfilled - [Section 6 of Annex 5](#)
- **Publication fees reimbursable only if publishing venue is full open access** (publication fees in hybrid journals not reimbursed)

The [Journal Checker Tool](#) can help to determine whether a specific publishing venue allows compliance with the open access obligations of Horizon Europe

Open Research Europe



Beneficiaries will have the possibility to publish at **no costs (during & post grant)** in [Open Research Europe](#), the European Commission open access publishing platform

Why Open Research Europe?

- **Support our open access policy** and beneficiary capacity to adhere to it and also enables **publishing post-grant**
- Leading by example in operationalising **open science principles** within scientific publishing and **enabling the European Research Area**
- Contribute to **transparency** and **cost-effectiveness** and explore **sustainable** open access publishing business models

What is Open Research Europe?

- **A peer-reviewed publishing platform. Not a repository.** Post-publication peer-review model. First beneficiaries publish, then review takes place. Publication and review reports open access under CC BY licenses. Optional service for the beneficiaries at no cost to them.

Trusted vs NOT trusted repository

Trusted repository: see [Annotated Grant Agreement](#)

- **Europe PMC** for life sciences including biomedicine and health;
- [ArXiv](#) for physics, mathematics, computer science, quantitative biology, quantitative finance and statistics;
- **Phonogrammarchiv** for audio-visual recordings;
- **CLARIN-DK-UCPH** repository for digital language data;
- **European Nucleotide Archive** or databases of astronomical observations;
- **Zenodo**, developed by CERN.
- Institutional repositories: **IRIS** in Italy, [HAL](#) in France, [DigitalCSIC](#) in Spain



Personal websites and databases, publisher websites, as well as cloud storage services (Dropbox, Google Drive, etc) are **NOT** considered repositories. Academia.edu, ResearchGate and similar platforms do not allow open access under the terms required and therefore are also **NOT** considered repositories.

Horizon Magazine

- The successful project is proposed by the Project Officer (PO) and/or communication correspondent in charge as a newsworthy story, and as a "safe one" (i.e. no risks in project management, no administrative issues, not under OLAF investigation)
- To request an article, you need to fill in this [TEMPLATE](#) and send it to RTD-HORIZON-MAGAZINE@ec.europa.eu with subject line "Request Template"
- An editorial team will assess the request according to its communication potential and, if approved, the contractor will propose an article outline for validation to the relevant Project, Policy and Communication Officers
- The project coordinators will be interviewed by the contractor's writers, and the draft article will be sent for validation to the interviewee, the relevant Project, Policy and Communication Officers
- The contractor will produce an article, a video, a carousel, and will promote them to via multipliers, media relations, advertising, and across Horizon Magazine and other EU R&I social media channels
- The production process will take at least **4 weeks**

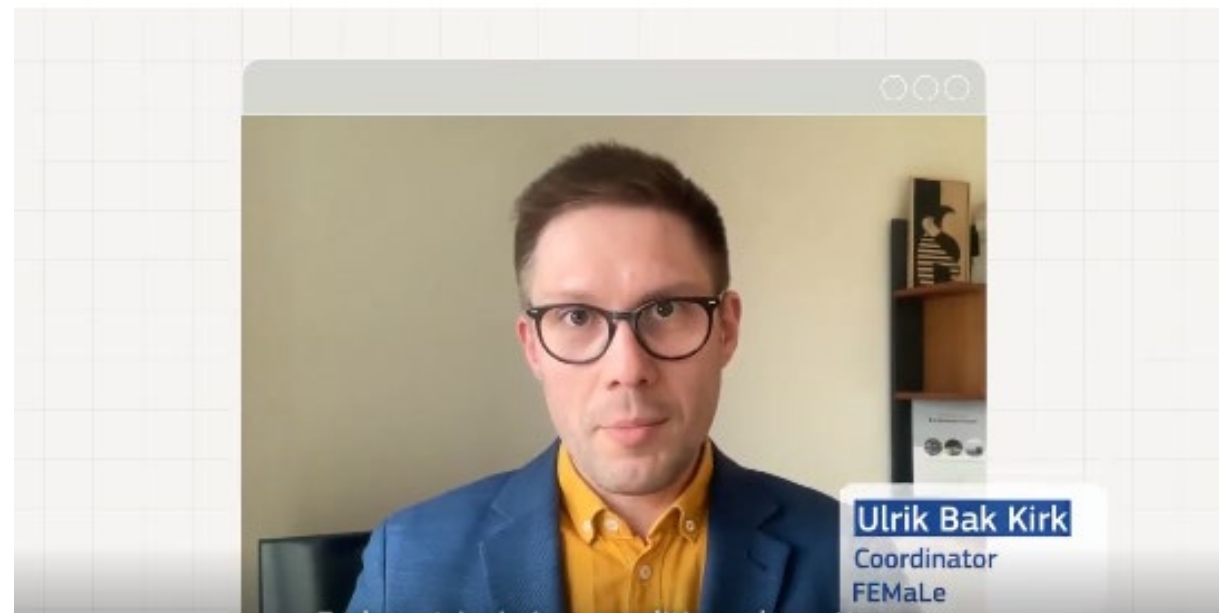

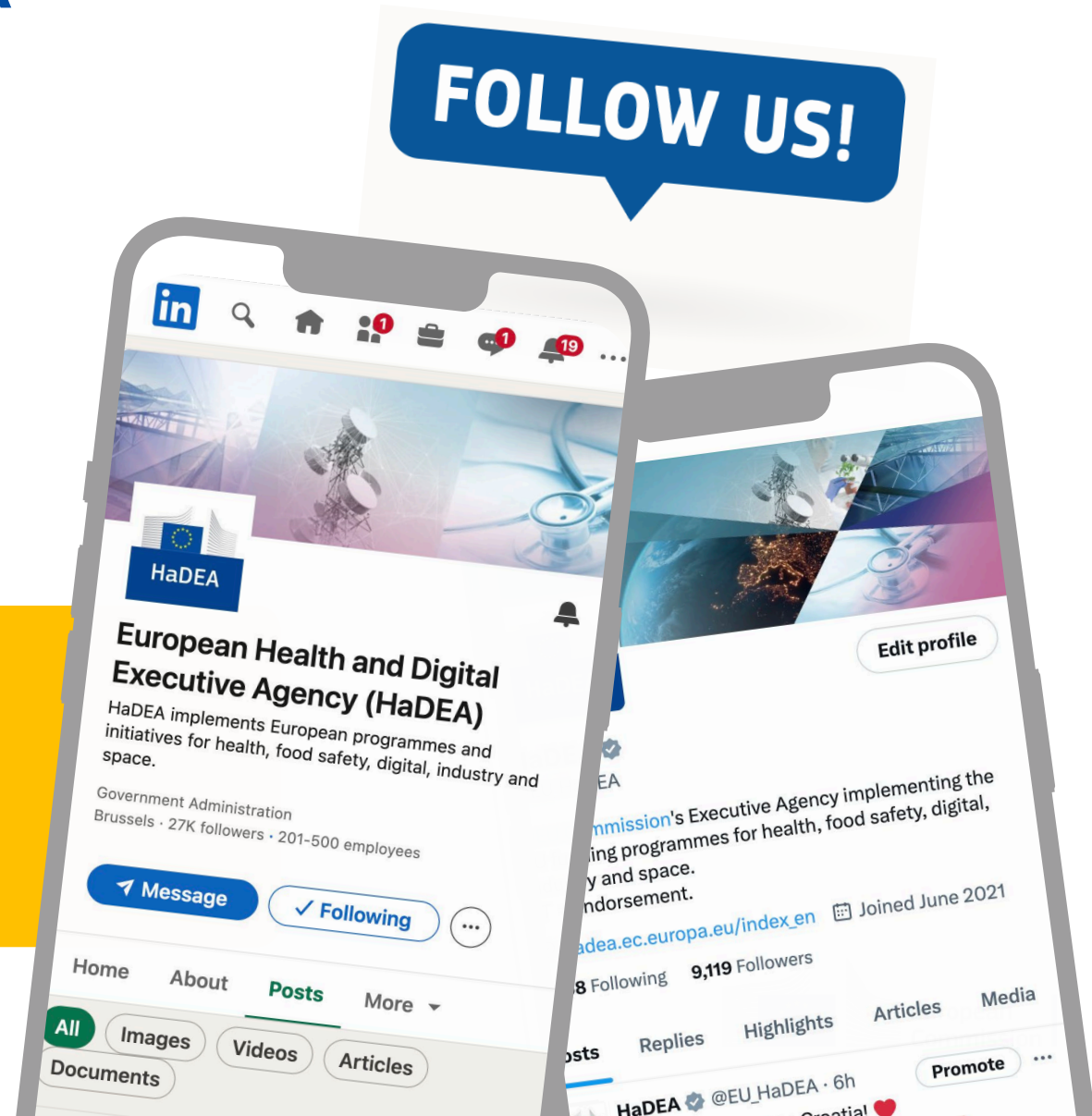
